Marine Pfc. Donald R. Kulpaca, son of Mr. and Mrs. William R. Kulpaca, of 4300 Emerald St., will complete four weeks of individual combat training July 1 at the Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton.

Marine Sgt. Edward G. Paulin, son of Mr. and Mrs. Russell Poulin of 19605 Darian Pl., serving with the Second Battalion, 1st Marine Division, which departed Camp Pendleton, Calif., June 3 to rotate with the 3rd Marine Division on Okinawa.

The rotation program is the first of its kind to be adopted by the Marine Corps and is designed to improve the stability of personnel and increase combat efficiency of the Corps' front-line units. Marines assigned to units of the rotation program will serve 15 months with the 1st Division at Camp Pendleton and 15 months with the 3rd Division on Okinawa.

Robert D. Reynolds, fireman apprentice, USN, son of Mrs. H. V. Reynolds of 1884 W. 282nd St., Lomita, and Albert W. Burns, gunner's mate first class, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Woolman of 5028 Laurette St., departed from San Diego last month aboard the destroyer USS Wedderburn for a tour of duty with the U.S. Seventh Fleet in the Western Pacific.

Rowell, a truck driver in the company in Mannheim, entered the Army in November 1958 and was last stationed at Fort Ord, Calif., where he received basic training. The 19-year-old soldier attended Narbonne High school.

1st Lt. John O'Connor, son of Mrs. A. O. O'Connor, 5340 Doris Way, is a navigator aboard a ski-equipped C-130 Hercules Prop Jet Transport now flying supplies and equipment to radar sites that will comprise the Eastern Extension of the Distant Early Warning Line (DEWline) in Northern Greenland.

A member of the 61st Troop Carrier Squadron of Tactical Air Command's 839th Air Division, Lieutenant O'Connor will spend most of the summer in the Arctic. Operating out of Sondrestrom, Greenland, the 61st will fly hundreds of miles into Arctic wasteland and land on isolated ice strips to deliver the supplies to this vital link in our nation's defense system.

Twelve TAC's C-130s have been equipped with the skis which permit either ski landings on ice or frozen snow or wheel landings on normal hard surface runways. The six-mile-a-minute Hercules is the largest operational Air Force aircraft to be equipped with skis. Sixteen aircrews have been trained in the operation of the ski planes, permitting rotation of personnel back to the U.S. for a two week rest every six weeks.
