Soul Subject Of Sunday's Lesson-Sermon

"Soul," seen to be a synonym for God, and that divine force which identifies and beautifies man in God's likeness, is the Lesson-Sermon subject in all Christian Science churches on Sunday.

Jesus' healing of blind Bartimaeus is cited in the fourth section of the sermon. After Bartimaeus had cried out to Jesus, the Master stopped, called him to his side and after questioning, healed him. Mark's account reads in conclusion, "And Jesus said unto him, Go thy way; thy faith hath made thee whole. And immediately he received his sight, and followed Jesus in the way" (10:52).

With this healing is correlated Mary Baker Eddy's statement in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" (p. 210), "Knowing that Soul and its attributes were for manifested through man, Master healed the sick, gave sight to the blind, hearing to the deaf, feet to the lame, thus bringing to light the scientific action of the divine Mind on human minds and bodies and giving a better understanding of Soul and salvation."

The Golden Text for the sermon is in the prophet's words from Psalms, "Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at his holy hill; for the Lord our God is holy" (99:9).
