Vico said that if arrangements are made all of Southern California will have a chance to meet the Southern area state champions.

In other developments concerning the Babe Ruth nine, Manager Bo Palica received a telegram which expressed the feeling of all Torrance residents following the 6-4 loss to the Palo Alto team, which subsequently went on to win the Western Regional Championship by defeating Phoenix, Arizona and Honolulu, Hawaii.


Torrance had captured six straight playoff games before losing the 6-4 decision to favored Palo Alto.
