South Bay Co-eds Win Scholarships

Two members of the first graduating class in the history of Immanuel Lutheran School, Redondo Beach, will attend Lutheran High School in Los Angeles this fall as scholarship winners.

The two are Bonnie Bangert, 823 Avenue C, Redondo Beach, and Karen Mundt, 707 Juanita Ave., Redondo Beach. They will be the recipients of scholarships awarded by the Federated Lutheran Women.

Also planning to attend Lutheran High this fall are the two remaining classmates of the winners who still reside in the South Bay area. They are Dianne Dillenbeck, 4507 Shar-yne Lane, Torrance, and Carol Green, 704 El Camino Real, Redondo Beach. Both applied for entrance after scholarships had been awarded.

A fifth member of the graduating class, Melody Johnson, has since moved to the Sacramento area, where she will enroll in Folsom Union High School. Miss Johnson was a resident of Torrance until she moved with her family in June.

To qualify for the scholarships, the coeds were required to give evidence of high standards of scholastic attainment and submit an essay to judges. As representatives of the Redondo Beach school's first graduating class, they are the only local students ever to appear for the highly-contested honors.

Bonnie Bangert, 14, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Norman Bangert, while Miss Mundt, also 14, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Mundt. Both will major in elementary education.

Both, with their fellow graduates, were pupils last year of Principal Myron Sternberg. All members of their class were accepted into membership of Immanuel Lutheran Church in June through the rite of confirmation.

Immanuel Lutheran will open its doors for the fourth year on September 10. This year, for the first time, three teachers will comprise the teaching staff. In addition to the principal, who will teach Grades 7 and 8, teachers will be Miss Dianna Bartelt, who will instruct Grades 4, 5 and 6, and Mrs. Doris Sternberg, who will teach the primary classes.

The school offers an extensive program of religious training in addition to normal secular elementary education.
