

**Books Subject of Semi-Weekly Meetings of South Bay Groups**

Reading and talking about great books, ancient and modern, is the business at hand during the informal, two hour, once-every-other-week meeting of the six discussion groups in the South Bay area sponsored by the national Great Books Foundation. Quiet reflective comment, as well as lively sociable debate spark the discussion periods, when busy and divergent lives come together to consider the writings and ideas of the thinkers of all ages who have dealt with the basic problems of mankind.

Shakespeare, Thoreau, Melville, Freud, and Aristotle are among the many works used in the program, which is a series of short books and excerpts designed to be read easily by members between meetings. No previous education is needed other than a willingness to read the brief and understandable works. Great Books members come from varied occupations, including housewives, businessmen, truckdrivers and engineers all coming together, as one member put it, "to discover the great questions, hear some of the great answers, in order better to choose."

Each of the six local groups follows the few recommendations of the national foundation, including its policy of keeping the program at minimum effort or cost to the participants. There are no fees or charges. The Foundation has for sale boxed sets of each year's readings, although purchase of these is not necessary.

Two leaders per group serve to stimulate thought and discussion by their questions, without lectures or commentary. The Great Books Foundation holds leader training courses each year. The "teacher" in any meeting is considered to be the author of the work chosen for that session.

The oldest group in this area begins its seventh year in September, and is led by Robert T. Thompson, of Torrance. The South Bay Group, meeting in El Retiro Park, is going into its third year. Leaders are Jim Pierson, Hermosa; Mrs. Louis Davis, Redondo Beach; Mrs. Charles Goodale, Torrance; and Chester Weislo, Hollywood Riviera. Mr. Pierson and Mrs. Davis are also Treasurer and Secretary, respectively, of the Los Angeles Great Books Council.

While most of the groups meet in the evening, the South Bay Muses attend morning sessions, are beginning their third year, and are led by Mrs. J. C. Anstrom, Hollywood Riviera, and Mrs. Sam Moran, Manhattan Beach.

Mr. and Mrs. William C. Cuthbertson lead another third year group in El Segundo.

A Torrance group beginning the second year program is led by John Robinson, Torrance; Donald Salk, Los Angeles; Mrs. George Englesby, Gardena; and Mrs. Robert G. Smith, Torrance.

A new first year group is being formed by Mrs. Smith and Bob Monroe, of Torrance.

Most of these programs will begin the fall with first meetings during the week of Sept. 21-28, which is to be Great Books Open House Week. Anyone with the desire to exchange ideas is cordially invited, and may obtain further information by telephoning Davenport 6-7940 or FR 9-0302.

The national foundation was incorporated in 1947 as a non-profit organization, and has since grown to more than 1500 groups throughout the United States. Its stated purpose is "to keep alive the common heritage of thought, sensibility, and faith which finds expression in the great books of our tradition; to give men, through reading and discussing the great books, a richer comprehension of what the good life can be; and to help them, here and now, to lead the good life, for themselves, their community and their nation."

Of the books themselves, the Foundation says: "They quickly show us how much more comfortable it is to stretch than to stoop. When we read them in the order of their appearance, with a group of our peers, we are caught up in and re-enact 'the great conversation' that produced our civilization."
