

## Physicals for School Athletes Begin August 27

Physical exams for students who plan to take part in football or cross-country at Torrance's three high schools are scheduled soon, according to athletic officials.

South High's physicals for varsity, jayvee, and bee footballers will be given on Thursday, Aug. 27, at the health office, with exams for cross-countrymen, returning cee footballers, and all ninth graders on Friday, Aug. 28. Students with last names starting with A through D are asked to report at 9; E-I at 10; J-M at 11; N-D at 1; Q-T at 2; and U-Z at 3 p.m. Make-ups will be at 3:30.

Torrance High varsity footballers will report to the boys' gym on Monday, Aug. 31, at 9 a.m., while Bee and Cee footballers and cross-countrymen will report on Tuesday, Sept. 1, at 9 a.m.

North High's varsity players will be examined starting at 9 a.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 2, by appointment, in the boys' gym. Bee and Cee lettermen will report from 1 to 4 p.m. on Sept. 2. Other Bee and Cee players, cross-countrymen and make-ups will report on Thursday, Sept. 3, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Parents who have questions about these sports may accompany their sons. Exams will be given by Dr. H. Veazie Markham, school physician.

All players will be required to take out insurance. Forms will be available at the examinations. Boys also will get information about teams, parent permission slips, and other data.




