**NOTICE TO BIDDERS**  
 Notice is hereby given that the Board of Education, Torrance Unified School District, hereinafter called the District, will receive sealed proposals until Sept. 11, 1959, for the construction of Towers Elementary School, located in Torrance, California.  
 Each bid will be in accordance with drawings, specifications, and other contract documents prepared by Roy Doner, A.I.A., Architect, 8320 Melrose Avenue, Los Angeles 46, California. Phone OLive 3-1733.  
 Plans and specifications may be examined and copies obtained upon a deposit of \$50.00 per set at the office of the Architect. Said deposit will be refunded upon the return of such copies in good condition within 5 days after bids are opened.  
 Each bid shall be made out on the forms as furnished by the Architect, and must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check or bid bond for not less than five per cent (5%) of the amount of bid, made payable to the District.  
 The above-mentioned check or bond shall be given as a guarantee that the bidder will enter into contract if awarded the work or any part thereof and will be declared forfeited if the successful bidder refuses to enter into contract after being requested to do so by the District.  
 Each bid shall be sealed and filed with the Assistant Superintendent. Bids, on or before the time and date shown above. Bids will be opened and read in public in the office of Mr. S. E. Waldrip, Assistant Superintendent, Business, located at 2335 Plaza del Amo, Torrance, California.  
 In accordance with the Labor Code of the State of California, the District has ascertained the general prevailing rate of wages for each craft or type of workman needed to execute the contract which will be awarded the
