The prophetic proclamation envisions opening day book store lines as long as a country dozen blocks and unfilled seats of book purchasers in classrooms manned by ruffled instructors ready to drop the unprepared from lengthy roll call lists.

"Be good scouts and 'Be Prepared,'" the college administrator cautions students.

The book store will be open daily, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

"Those who consult book lists now posted in the campus facility will avoid missing classes, standing in insufferably long and hot September lines and risking the possibility of early sell-outs of some texts," Sloan advised.

"Until new book store facilities are erected," the director stated, "we can only avoid book store conditions by a vigorous emphasis of early book and supply purchase!"
