
She is survived by her husband, Robert H. Peal; a son, Bobby Peal; and three grandsons, Robbie, Stephen, and Bobbie.

Culmination of the summer program for children was combined with registration for fall church classes Sunday at the Pacific Unitarian Church in Torrance.


Children 5 through 10 presented a number called "Music and Movement," which was introduced by Linda Gaeder, who has taught the children's summer dance workshop.
