F&G Director Recommends Angling Rules

Fish and Game Director William E. Warne announced yesterday he will recommend for 1960 a set of simplified angling regulations highlighted by a uniform Northern California summer trout season opener, on May 6, and a statewide daily bag limit of 10 fish.

The season in the North Coast counties of Del Norte, Humboldt and parts of Trinity, Mendocino and Lake would open May 30.

All summer trout seasons would close Oct. 31.

Southern California would continue to have all-year fishing for trout, with the bag limit remaining at its present 10 fish in the summer and 5 in the winter. The Department proposes the summer bag limit be the same throughout the State from May 6 to Oct. 31.

At present there are three different summer trout regulations in Southern California, two of them in San Diego County.

The recommendations will be submitted to the California Fish and Game Commission when it meets in Los Angeles Oct. 9. Final regulations for 1960 will be made by the Commission in Sacramento on Dec. 8.

"We have concentrated our efforts this year upon simplification of the regulations, which have become very long and involved," Warne declared. "We are recommending repeal of 39 sections which are not needed to protect our inland and ocean fish resources, and we are proposing simplification of a number of others," he said.

Waterfowl Season Due Wednesday

With California's 1959-60 waterfowl hunting season to open at 12 noon on Wednesday, the Department of Fish and Game today issued the following review of the combined advance reservation and first-come first-served system of issuing hunting permits on its Imperial Waterfowl Management Area and eight other state-operated waterfowl areas throughout the state.

Hunters holding advance reservations have priority on the state-managed areas but unfilled hunter quotas are filled by issuing permits on a first-come first-served basis each hunting day at the hunting area checking station.

SHOOTING DAYS on the state areas are Wednesdays, Saturdays, Sundays, opening and closing days of each half of the season, Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day until noon.

There is a \$2 permit fee for hunters 16 or more years of age but no charge for hunters under 16. Fees are collected at the hunting area permit station as the permits are issued.

An advance reservation permit is valid for two hunters 16 years of age or over, one of whom must be the person to whom the reservation is issued. The other may be any eligible hunter whom the person receiving the reservation selects as a partner, provided that person selected has not been issued a permit, under the reservation plan, on the area concerned for the current half of the season. There is no limit on the number of times a person may hunt on a first-come first-served basis.
