### Concert Series Ticket Campaign To Get Under Way Here This Week

Season tickets for adults for the four concerts will sell for \$4, students' tickets for \$2, he said. All concerts will be held at the Campus Theater at El Camino College.

IN ADDITION to the Los Angeles Brass Quintet, the Los Angeles Flute Club will be presented with the Youth Band on Feb. 5, 1960, and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir of Southern California on March 19.

The final event will be the band's Fourteenth Anniversary Concert on May 21. The fourth concert is played entirely by the band and has as soloists the four winners of the young music competition scholarships. The four scholarships, with a \$100 cash award for each, are given to winners of competitions held in voice, piano, strings, and wind instruments. The Torrance Juniors

Women's Club sponsors the competitions.

IN ADDITION to the final concert series program, the scholarship winners perform at the season's final meeting for the Women's Club in April.

A preview of the March concert featuring the Mormon Choir will be offered on the Steve Allen Show tomorrow night on Channel 4 when the choir fills a guest spot on the show.

The choir has previously appeared at the Hollywood Bowl, Redlands Bowl, San Diego's Fiesta Del Pacifico, and many radio and television shows.
