Casting for the forthcoming production of Tennessee Williams' "Orpheus Descending," will proceed on schedule, Director Ed Long of Hampton Players announced yesterday.

Tryouts for the cast of nine female and 10 male parts will be held Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, Oct. 12 through 14, in the Hampton Players Theater, 100 Wall St., Redondo Beach. Readings will begin at 7:30 each evening.

"Orpheus Descending," Long says, is Williams' statement on man's need to accept the conditions of his existence, and the tragic consequences when nonacceptance leads to futile strivings for earthly atonement and resurrection.

THE PLAY is set in the town of Glorious Hill in the Deep South.

Jabe Torrance owner of the local mercantile store, is dying. Lady Torrance, in the midst of her husband's dying, attempts to resurrect her lost youth through construction of a confectionery which is a likeness of a wine garden in which she had experienced her first love, and through an affair with an itinerant guitar player who drifts into town in search of his life's meaning.

WITH THE ACTION of the play sweeping to a climax period in late winter and early spring Jabe, seeing his own hell in the resurrected wine garden and sensing Lady's rebirth through her affair with the guitarist, cannot control his rage at being a dying man in the midst of this renaissance, even though he would like to atone for his nefarious past.

He swoops down with pistol-enforced potency on the bizzards who would pick over the remnants of his emaciated being.

The play is scheduled to make its debut here Jan. 15, Long said. All persons are welcome to attend the cast readings, he added.
