





Garden Checklist

By California Association of Nurserymen

1. You can shop for a living Christmas tree any time now. It will make a wonderful tubbed plant for porch or terrace between now and the holiday season.
2. Disbudding camellias this month will result in prize-winning blooms later on. Disbud to at least three inches apart.
3. The smell of burning leaves is an autumn tradition and should serve to remind the gardener that it's time to rake fallen leaves in his own garden.
4. Ground covers planted in fall take advantage of winter rains to establish themselves.
5. Don't overlook Ranunculus and Anemones when shopping nurseries for bulbs to brighten your garden next spring.

All these food products are worthy of special attention, and you'll find massive displays of all... or most of them... at your favorite market.

TRY A NEW SHAPE

Do you know that there are more than 150 shapes of macaroni foods? Please your family and surprise your guests by presenting something new. There are shells, bows, stars, alphabets, spirals, cork screws, little pipes, large tubes, turbans, straight ribbons and curly ribbons. Or take your choice from the long list of spaghetti varieties: long, elbow, spiral, flat, fat and thin. As for noodles, there are fine ones, broad and medium.

Macaroni foods (regardless of size and shape) may be used interchangeably in recipes. Just substitute them weight for weight.

Meat Counters will bulge with fine items... and many at low cost. Poultry, particularly Turkeys and Chickens... and that means both fryers and stewing chickens... will be of special interest. You've been using many turkey parts during the summer. Now get a beautiful, large turkey into the oven, and forget about it until

30 minutes before meal time, when you'd remove it from the oven. Complete the rest of the meal, and then send that golden bird to the table for carving.

Pork, all cuts, abundant and truly delicious and nourishing. Lamb and Beef are in ample supply, but in most instances not quite the comparable "buy" of pork and poultry.

Cheese. Meals are a breeze with cheese. Casseroles excel with goodness when cheese is added. It adds piquancy to green salads. Cheese is the golden ribbons atop pizza creations; the leisurely melting filling for tender omelets. Your markets are well supplied with all members of the cheese family during this month of festivals... October.

Big Cranberry crop. The 1958 crop is a record breaker... 29 per cent above average. Our neighbors, Oregon and Washington, indicate their crops to be the biggest in history.

Apple Time. Jonathan, McIntosh, Pippin, Rome Beauty, and both the Golden and Red Delicious. Every family has a favorite variety... and if yours isn't here you'll find a good substitute. These are available in markets, or you may drive to the orchards. The Oak Glen district, about 80 miles east of Los Angeles, has fine apples ready to sell at roadside stands.
