First Baptist Church To Dedicate New Building

The First Baptist Church of Lomita, located at Hillcrest and Western, will observe homecoming and open house Sunday, Aug. 14th.

THE EDUCATIONAL building consists of 20 Sunday School rooms, six department assemblies, four tiled rest rooms, two large beginner departments that will care for kindergarten and first grade. Church library, and office for the educational director.

Following a potluck fellowship lunch, the afternoon program will include the dedication of the new building, recog-


