Pop Warner Grid Tryouts Set at Torrance Park

The first tryouts for Torrance's new Pop Warner boys' tackle football teams will be held this weekend at Torrance Park, according to association officials.

Registered boys in the 65-115 pound weight classes will be put through their drills between 9 a.m. and noon on both Saturday and Sunday, it has been announced.

Registrations will still be accepted at the tryouts, but officials request that both parents be present.

To be eligible for the peeewe (65-90 pounds) or midget (up to 115) teams boys must reside within the city limits and come within the 9 to 12 age divisions.

A boy must be nine before Aug. 1 or 13 after Aug. 1 to qualify.
