Retirement of Don Black as assistant to the director of public relations for the Douglas Aircraft company was announced today by Richard J. Davis, director of public relations. Black, a veteran Southern California newspaperman and public relations executive, had reached the company's prescribed retirement age after 19 years with Douglas. Charles R. Chappell, who became assistant to the director of public relations last January, assumes the responsibilities formerly held by Black, Davis said.

Before entering the public relations field, Black had worked as reporter and city editor on a number of Southern California newspapers and had been managing editor of the San Pedro Daily News. He was manager of the news bureau for Western Air Express in Los Angeles, west coast manager of the TWA news bureau and news bureau manager for United Air Lines. Black began his aviation career during World War I with the U.S. Air Service in Europe.

David Nelson Wins Victor Co. Scholarship

David Nelson, teenage son of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth C. He is presently an account executive for national accounts in the Victor Los Angeles Branch.

Brown Answers Chamber Call For Contract

Governor Edmund G. "Pat" Brown assured the Torrance Chamber this week that his office would take prompt action in consummating a contract with the Metropolitan Water District to insure Southern California proper receipt of water. The Chamber Board of Directors passed a strongly worded resolution last month urging the Governor "to call upon the State officials engaged in water contract negotiations to prepare and submit a proposed contract with the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California as soon as possible to the end that the people of Torrance and the directors of the MWD may be able to reach a decision as to their position with regard to the \$1,700,000,000 water bond issue in ample time prior to the Nov. 8, 1960 general election."

Chamber President, R. S. "Dick" Pyle, said that his group felt the State was "dragging its feet" in the negotiations. Pyle added that since the area covered by MWD will be called upon to pay some 60 percent of the cost of the Feather River Project, and Torrance taxpayers are included, the Chamber feels "prompt action" is needed.

In his answer to the Chamber, Governor Brown said, "Whatever contract is executed will endure for from 50 to 75 years and it lies in the best interest of all citizens of the State of California, as well as other contracting parties, to see that it is carefully drafted." Brown added, "I can assure you that every effort has been and is being made to consummate a contract with the Metropolitan Water District."
