Church Operated School to Begin 10th Year of Classes

Calvary Baptist Elementary School begins its tenth year in Gardena with an enrollment of over 200 students in its kindergarten through sixth grades. On Sunday, Sept. 11th special recognition will be given to this anniversary in services held by Calvary Baptist Church, 2818 Manhattan Beach Blvd. School opens Sept. 12 with the highest enrollment in its history.

Ten years ago a kindergarten was begun on faith in the back of a temporary building. Mrs. Pauline Skillman was the teacher and she had 13 pupils. During the years, as people saw and felt the need for a good basic education for their children, the school expanded rapidly until it was necessary to build one, then finally two new buildings to accommodate the rapid growth.

Carson.

After a varied list of summer guest speakers, the church congregation welcomes back its minister, Richard Seebode, who will speak on "Creative Freedom," Sept. 10, at 11 a.m. The public is welcome.

ON SUNDAY, Sept. 11, special recognition will be given to Mrs. Jean Issacs, first grade teacher, who is beginning her ninth year of service. She has taught as many as three grades in the same classroom as the school went through its formative years. She now guides her children through their early years of reading as she uses a combination of phonics and sight recognition which has proved to be very successful.

Other faculty members are: Mrs. Jean Paul, kindergarten; Mrs. Marie Hodel, second grade; Miss Alice Banker, third; Rev. Alfred Young, fifth; Mrs. Fay Anderson, sixth; and M. Thomas Kelly, principal and fourth grade teacher.

ALL TEXTS, workbooks, pencils, paper, crayons, supplies, and materials are furnished free to the students. Registration and insurance fees are \$13, tuition is \$12.50 per month for kindergarten and \$18.00 for the grades.

Pole Sitter Joined by Two Seals

Two seals, captured by Captain St. Dennis on Santa Barbara Island, have joined the Mad Englishman at the Manhattan Motors lot in Manhattan Beach. The seals, in a tub of water at the foot of the 65-foot pole on which the Englishman is perched, have attracted almost as many people as the pole sitter himself.

When first put at the foot of the flagpole, the Englishman was somewhat taken back and some even say he was hurt, however, he has settled down a bit and accepted the seals.

And present plans call for the Mad Englishman to remain on the 5 by 5 platform 65 feet above the Manhattan Beach skyline until he breaks the existing world record for flagpole sitting.

Fall Classes For Parents Due Sept. 15
