

Danger of Food Poisoning Can Be Avoided

There are three ways in which foodborne illnesses are usually caused: (1) by means of bacterial contamination resulting in food infection or toxic production; (2) when the food itself is poisonous as in the case of certain mushrooms or (3) by accidental contamination of the food with some chemical poison. But most outbreaks of food poisoning, such as the one that recently occurred in a local food poisoning incident, are due to bacterial contamination.

Chief among the bacteria that cause food poisoning are certain strains of staphylococci, Salmonella, some types of streptococci, and Clostridium botulinum. However, the most common type of bacterial food contamination that is widespread throughout the United States results from food contact.

IN THIS TYPE of food contamination, poisoning is not caused by the organism itself—as it is in salmonellosis or streptococcal food infection, but by the toxin that is formed when the bacteria reproduce and multiply in the food.

Foods most favorable to the growth of staphylococci are custards and cream-filled desserts that have not been properly refrigerated or have stood at room temperature for several hours. Other very susceptible foods under these conditions include meat, chicken, turkey, fish and egg salads, creamed dishes, meat loaf, gravy, dressings, and other cooked foods consisting largely of protein.

AMONG THE protein foods, ham—particularly tenderloin ham, and turkey are perhaps the items most frequently incriminated in food poisoning outbreaks, for these foods are tampered by the staphylococci so often served at receptions, banquets, picnics and the like. Many persons have cooked safe food for years, but when called upon to produce large amounts of such foodstuffs for special occasions find that their refrigeration facilities are inadequate. Even the most carefully prepared foods become unsafe to eat when left at room temperature for more than 3 hours or are put in an already overcrowded refrigerator.

Sudden illness is characteristic of staphylococcal food poisoning. In the majority of cases, symptoms appear in from 2 to 4 hours after the food is eaten but may occur as soon as half an hour or as long afterwards as six hours.

NAUSEA and vomiting, cramps and diarrhea may be severe, but recovery usually takes place 12 to 36 hours after expulsion of the poison from the body. Understandably enough, if large amounts of the contaminated food is consumed and if the individual is susceptible to the poison, the illness may be quite an experience.

No matter how much care is taken in the preparation of food, the widespread dissemination of staphylococci ensures an almost equally widespread contamination of food since these germs are always present on the human skin, in the nose, mouth and throat, and are also found in the air. It is therefore necessary to prevent the growth of these bacteria in food by means of proper food handling, cooking, and storage methods.

Good personal hygiene must be practiced, and coughing and sneezing around food must be controlled. Extra care must be taken in those cases where the food is handled by the bare hands and served without cooking. And no one with any type of skin infection should handle food at all.
