### Classes for Expectant Parents Begin Sept. 26 Says Red Cross

A new mother and baby care class will be offered this fall to expectant parents living in the greater South Bay area by the American Red Cross, it is announced by Mrs. Agnes Wright, 713 S. Catalina, Redondo Beach, nursing services chairman.

"We urge all prospective mothers and fathers within the area from El Segundo to Torrance, as well as the beach district, to take advantage of this three and one half week course," declared Mrs. Wright.

The classes will be held from 7 to 9 p.m., Mondays and Wednesdays, starting on Sept. 26 at the new location of the South Bay branch of Red Cross, 109 Emerald St., Redondo Beach.

"This class is planned by Red Cross to provide expectant parents with the newest techniques for simple and safe infant care," said Mrs. Wright. "Subjects included in the course will be planning the layette, selecting suitable nursery equipment, preparation of formula, bathing the baby and other vital information."

Mrs. Phyllis Chamness, a Red Cross instructor, will teach the class.

### Civic Symphony Group Votes to Sponsor Youth Symphony in Area

After several months of intensive work and planning, the board of directors of the Civic Symphony has voted to sponsor a Youth Symphony in the South Bay area. The new orchestra will be composed of young musicians throughout the area.

The group is currently seeking all youngsters in the area who play instruments and are interested in the group. Persons interested are asked to call or write to the symphony board and leave their names.

The Civic Symphony has always been especially interested in young musicians and has awarded a number of such scholarships yearly since 1949. Now it is also setting up a foundation to help worthy young musicians to acquire fine instruments. A \$500 oboe and \$400 bassoon are among the purchases recently approved by the board. These are given to deserving students who are allowed to buy them,

if they wish, so that the money can be used again for other young artists.

The first symphony concert ever given here for school children was in Hermosa Beach by the Civic Symphony in 1958, and there are more to come. Young people are encouraged to get acquainted with the professional players in the symphony rehearsals and some of the young players who were proteges of the conductor, Elyse Aehle, some years ago are now in top positions in the musical world.

A number of outstanding young players are already enrolled in this orchestra. A fine trumpeter, oboist, violinist, pianist, and bassoonist are among them.

The name of the conductor of the orchestra will be announced soon together with the detailed plans for rehearsals and music. Be sure to send in your names as soon as possible.


### Deputy D. A. Signed To Teach Adult Class
