Maxine Elaine Anderson was born in Ohio on July 23, 1910, and died in Torrance on Aug. 22, 1960. She attended school in Byesville, Ohio, and after graduation entered Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio, in 1928 where she studied teacher training. She taught school in Guernsey County, Ohio, before coming to California in 1935.

She was married to John O. Anderson in Los Angeles in January, 1935. She was united with the Methodist Church in Byesville, Ohio, in early life and held her membership there until this year when she transferred to the First Methodist Church of Torrance.

She had one sister, Mrs. Rachel Burt, a graduate nurse of Byesville, who came to California Aug. 4 to care for her.






