The Los Angeles Lakers have announced that arrangements have been completed for a seven-game pre-season tour of several Southland cities with the World's Champion Boston Celtics. The series will open with a charity game in the Sports Arena, Sunday, Oct. 9, and will then move on successive nights to Bakersfield, San Bernardino, Long Beach, Santa Barbara, San Diego and Anaheim.

The Lakers, the newest member of Southern California's major league sports fraternity, will be getting ready for their first season in the NBA, and in scheduling the tour with Boston, they will give basketball fans in other Southland cities their first in-person glimpse of "The World's Fastest Game."

The Laker-Celtic series will renew one of the hardest fought rivalries in all of major league sports, that between the two-time world champions from Boston and the most successful team in the overall history of major league basketball, the Lakers.

The Celtics will bring with them a star-studded roster, celled by some experts the greatest team in the history of the game.
