Parents of the 27,000 children in Torrance Schools will be asked to take part in a "quiz" that will bring more than \$200,000 into school coffers.

Under federal law, the schools are entitled to federal funds for each parent who is employed in an aircraft plant, one of the services, or in some industry with federal contracts or connections.
