

Of Service Beginning on Nov. 1 Campfire Girls to Note 50 Years

A record of 156,981 man-hours without a lost-time accident has been worked by servicemen of the Southern California Gas Co.'s Yukon base.

Under the guidance of supervisor J. S. McCurdy, the southwest gas men, who service the cities and communities of Inglewood, Lennox, Westchester, Hawthorne, Gardena, El

Segundo, and parts of southwest Los Angeles did not suffer a disabling accident during the 2½ year period from Jan. 1, 1958, through June 30, 1960.

The group was honored recently at a special safety award dinner in Westchester, where they were presented a plaque by gas company safety engineer Carl Pullman.

Among special guests at the dinner were supervisor of employee relations A. W. Turner and the company's manager of customer service, R. F. Ogborn.

In complimenting the men on their record, Ogborn said, "Their careful attention to good safety practices assures better and safer service for the customers."
