### 11th Century Bookbinding To Join Madonna Row Here

Christmas spirit at El Camino College will soon be represented by the famous Madonna Row reproductions of great works of art representing the Madonna and Christ child.

The replicas to be exhibited in front of the El Camino College Administration Building during the Christmas season will consist of mosaics, paintings, and stained glass.

Miss Mildred K. Walker, El Camino art instructor, announced that an 11th century bookbinding made for Bishop Bernward of Hildesheim is being reproduced by the art department and will be exhibited for the first time during the holiday season.

**THE ORIGINAL** bookbinding was gold with inset jewels and contained an ivory panel in the center.

The replica will be six feet wide and eight feet long. The side panels, which will be of tooled metal, will be set with simulated jewels. The original ivory panel is to be copied first in clay and a plaster mold cast of the model. The final casting of the panel will be in hydrostone.

**MISS WALKER** is coordinating the annual Christmas art presentation and Richard L. Oliver and Joseph E. Gadden, also instructors within the art

department, are assisting her. "Through a desire to establish the true Christmas spirit at El Camino and stay in keeping with the modern structure of the college," Miss Walker said, "Madonna Row was inaugurated in 1948."

**TWELVE PIECES** of art will make up this year's showing of Madonna Row.

They are:  
Madonna of the Harpies, an oil painting which is a replica of Andrea del Sarto's; Gian Batista Piazzetta's "Virgin and Child"; Raphael's "The Cowper Madonna"; El Greco's "The Virgin with Santa Inez and Santa Tecla"; Jan Van Eyck's "Ince Hall Madonna"; Botticelli's "The Virgin and Child"; Lorenzo Lotto's "Rest on the Flight to Egypt"; and Raphael's "Madonna Tempi."

"**BLUE MADONNA** of Chartres," a reproduction in stained glass was added to the row in 1956. Twelfth century mosaic "Madonna and Child," from a Byzantine prayer book, was completed for display in 1954.

"The Nativity Panel" from the Isenheim altarpiece was reproduced in 1959. "Nativity," a 12th century Byzantine mosaic from a small village in Greece, which was reproduced in 1958, will also be shown.

### Noted Pianist to Perform With South Bay Orchestra

Harold Cone, pianist and friend of Korean composer-conductor Eakhtay Ahn, will be

guest soloist when Ahn conducts the Civic Symphony Orchestra in concert at Redondo High School next Sunday evening.

He has recently concluded a European tour which included appearances with the London Philharmonic, and Madrid Philharmonic, and later played with top orchestras of South and Central America before returning to New York for the Lewisohn Stadium concerts.

The Dec. 4 concert featuring the two world-famous musicians will be held at the Redondo auditorium under the auspices of the Civic Symphony's board of directors headed by Jan Darian.

Ahn, who is a former student and colleague of Richard Strauss, has been visiting in the area, and is directing rehearsals of the augmented orchestra for next week's performance.
