New English Bible Selling Well; Still Leaves Many Readers Cool

Sales in England of "The New English Bible: New Testament," according to Newsweek, are going better than "Lady Chatterley's Lover."

Officially dedicated at ceremonies in Westminster Abbey last week, the new Bible is the result of 13 years of scholarly labor by translators who felt that the 350-year old King James Version no longer is readily understandable. Already it has won wide, though far from complete acceptance.

THERE IS agreement among the new Bible's supporters and critics that its passages are clearer to contemporary ears. The new version of the King James passage "neither cast ye your pearls before swine" (Matt. 7:6) is "do not feed your pearls to pigs." The clearer, yes; but defenders of the poetic King James Version ask: will it be quoted 350 years from now, as thousands of King James biblical verses are today?

In the current issue of Horizon magazine, editor William Harlan Hale deprecates the new translation as "the jargon of official handout writers and lower echelon bureaucrats." He objects to such "updatings" as:

"I HAVE come accredited by my Father" for "I come in my Father's name"; "My testimony is valid" for "I bear record of myself."

"A man was giving a big dinner party and had sent out many invitations" for "A certain man made a great supper, and bade many; and it is prophesy that builds up a Christian community" for "He that prophesieth edifieth the church."

Commenting on these particular revisions, Hale doubts that there is anything very inspirational in reading about "a duly accredited Christ arriving with valid testimony to attend high level dinner parties for the sake of community building."

In his resurrection and ascension, Jesus showed that a mortal man is not the real essence of manhood, and that this unreal material mortality disappears in presence of the reality."
