City Has Grown Like 'Topsy' Kurtz Says, Needs Master Plan

Recent civic upheavals involving zoning fights in Torrance have pointed up the urgency for a master plan for the city, George Kurtz, attorney and council candidate, declared this week.

"The fact is," Kurtz said, "Torrance is growing more like

Topsy than a modern, progressive city." Current balances among industrial, commercial and residential development are, he pointed out, at least partly "fortuitous" rather than the result of careful charting of future growth patterns.

"If we are to achieve our

goal of a balanced city economy in modern and attractive community, we must provide the patterns for orderly growth," he said. Torrance has no such master plan for the future now, Kurtz commented, and no such overall blueprint is being contemplated.

Torrance, built on a strong industrial base early in the century, has changed dramatically in the direction of residential development during the postwar population boom. "The fact that we still enjoy a reasonable commercial-industrial-residential balance can be traced to the early industrial personality of Torrance," Kurtz said, "but to keep the balance for tomorrow, we need good thinking, not just good chance."

CORRELATION of the city's several "sub-plans" to a master plan for city development will minimize bitter zoning struggles by self-interest groups, and will provide prospective industries, businesses and homeowners with foreknowledge that their investments are protected from spur-of-the-moment zoning decisions, Kurtz said.

"Any city planning commission is as good as the city policies it has to work with," Kurtz said, "without a master plan, drawn with foresight and based on predictable growth patterns, a planning group must concentrate its efforts on individual problems as they arise, hoping to be able to solve them in ways that will be compatible with the next problems to come along."
