Current allocations to Community Chest-supported services in the Harbor area were announced at the monthly meeting of the Welfare Federation area board held Thursday at the Torrance YMCA.

des, Rolling Hills and Hollywood Riviera, \$2004; and Seaman's Church Institute, 101 W. 11th St., San Pedro, \$9,600.

Nine Local Teachers Get Study Grants

Nine Torrance teachers have been selected for special summer scholarships in foreign language, science, and math, according to word received by school officials. Richard Bannehr and Mrs. Paula Grahmer, German teachers at Torrance and North High respectively were selected for summer scholarships in Germany. They were awarded under terms of the National Defense Education Act and Stanford University grants. (Mrs. Grahmer's husband, Robert, a teacher at Hawthorne High, also was chosen for the scholarship). Throughout the U.S., 78 teachers were chosen.

NATIONAL Science Foundation scholarships were awarded seven Torrance teachers. North High teachers Robert Martin, biology, and Richard Venturini, physics, will attend UCLA. Torrance High School's Robert McKnight will study radiation biology at the University of New Mexico and Alfred Smith will take biology at SC. South High's Grant Jones will study biology at Ball State Teachers' College, Ind.

Frank Small, North High, will study math at Georgetown University, Washington, D.C., while Jack Knapp, Torrance
