

Richardson Bangs Three Hits, Hurls Legion Team to 10-4 Win

Other big bats were wielded by outfielder Rick Jacobs who had a perfect 3 for 3 day at the plate, and by Joe Montgomery, who doubled home two runs.

In going the nine-inning route, Richardson fanned 12 batters and was nicked for eight hits.

Modern tendencies and conveniences have caused many persons fifty years of age and over to feel that participating sports are not intended for them.

In hopes of disproving this fallacy, a new bowling club has recently been established in the South Bay area expressly for men and women who have reached the mid-century of their life, and who are determined not to spend their remaining years confined to a rocking chair viewing others actively participating in sports over TV.

THE NEW CLUB, whose slogan is "Stay young, stay happy, stay healthy," was founded by Ruth Caudle of 1303 Electric Street, in Gardena. Mrs. Caudle, acting as 'Queen pin' for the new club, is 54, and most en-

thusiastic about the oldster's role on the bowling alley. After suffering from a nervous breakdown, Mrs. Caudle started bowling two years ago at her doctor's request.
