Board Studies New Employee Deduction Plan

A proposal to limit payroll deduction to school employee groups who have at least 75 per cent of the eligible employees enrolled has been taken under advisement for a month by the board of education to give affected groups time to present their views.

Because of the budget limitations, a plan was advanced which would require employee groups to collect their own dues, or ask for the deductions before they would be made. Most deductions except those required by law would be subject to the plan, it was indicated.

Richard Kendall, president of Local 1101, asked time be given for employees to present their views on the subject.


