Torrance Gets June DMV Funds

The Department of Motor Vehicles announced that Torrance received a June apportionment of \$456,658.23 as the fiscal year came to a close. The local group received a payment of \$116,231.23. An advance in April of \$340,427 rounds out the total apportionment.

The revenues, derived from motor vehicle license fees and collected by the State, are apportioned principally to local governments because the levy takes the place of a property tax on the vehicle.

It was the third such distribution during the fiscal year which ended June 30.
