The Greyfriars Orthodox Presbyterian Church, 22511 S. Figueroa, will hold special services to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of this denomination.

A united celebration will be held this week in Philadelphia where the church was born, and where the General Assembly of the church meets this year.

Dr. David Calderwood is the pastor of the local Orthodox Presbyterian Church in Torrance. He will preach next Sunday morning on the theme "Continuing the Presbyterian Heritage."

Special music will be arranged by the choir under the direction of Will Power.

MRS. MARY Ann Haslet will be in charge of the refreshments to be served following the worship service which begins at 11 o'clock. Dr. Calderwood has been appointed a delegate to the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Ireland to convey the greetings of the Orthodox Presbyterian church of the United States, and so will be absent from his church for three months.

Dr. Calderwood has been pastor for 11 years and was handed a handsome check by the congregation last Sunday morning to relieve him of any financial worries over the trip.

Jaracz Assigned to Local Circuit for Witnesses

Recently appointed District Supervisor for Southern California, part of Nevada and Arizona, Theodore Jaracz has also been assigned to California Circuit No. 16 semi-annual assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses to be held at George Washington High School, 108th St. and Denker.

Born in Kentucky, 1925, Jaracz has been associated with the New World Society of Jehovah's Witnesses for the past 21 years, and has participated in all major conventions since 1946. Jaracz has visited congregations and circuits in the Middle West, East, Atlantic seaboard, and Gulf states, Rocky Mountain region and western states. He is now serving his seventeenth year in the full-time ministry.

A GRADUATE of the Watchtower Bible College of Gilead located at South Lansing, New York, he spent close to six years in foreign missionary work in the South Pacific, working out of the branch office at Sydney Australia. He visited European conventions in 1955, traveling around the world. He has addressed convention audiences as a speaker at many district assemblies from 1948-1960, including the New York International Assembly in 1953.

"Walk in the Name of Jehovah Forever" is the assembly theme and is the title of the keynote address to be given by Jaracz on opening night, Friday, June 23, at 7 p.m. Many delegates from the Torrance Congregation and seventeen other congregations will be represented at the convocation at George Washington High School auditorium, 108th and Denker, Los Angeles, with an expected peak attendance of 3000 persons at 3 p.m. Sunday, June 25, when Jaracz delivers an informative, free Bible lecture.




