### New Health Pamphlets Now Ready

Four new health education pamphlets on chest diseases, designed for use by the general public, have been produced by the Tuberculosis and Health Assn. of Los Angeles County, it was announced today.

Dean L. Sears, 1433 Post Ave., chairman of the crippling respiratory disease fund raising campaign in this area, said the four new pamphlets are part of the series entitled "The ABC's of Chest Disease."

The health education material released this week covers general breathing function, emphysema, bronchial asthma and coccidioidomycosis (valley fever).

Sears pointed out that the voluntary health agency is now conducting a mail fund raising campaign in Torrance and that educational material on crippling respiratory diseases is being made available to the general public as part of the Association's year-round educational program.
