**Park Facilities Set July 4th Celebrations**

Parks, beaches, golf courses, and swimming pools are being readied by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation to accommodate the crowds which are expected to use these facilities over the July 4 Independence Day celebrations.

County Recreation Department officials anticipate they will have record-breaking crowds because of the continuing increase of population.

There will be free pyrotechnics shows at 8 p.m. at Arcadia County Park, 405 S. Santa Anita Ave., Arcadia; Alondra Regional Park, 3535 W. Redondo Beach Blvd; and at Altadena County Golf Course, 1456 E. Mendocino St., Altadena.

County ordinances prohibit the possession or shooting of fireworks by individuals in all county recreational facilities. The night pyrotechnics shows are to be presented by non-profit organizations under special county permit.

**Speed Reading Course Opens at Harbor College**

An additional speed reading class has been opened during the evening hours for the summer session at Harbor College, according to an announcement today by Dwight L. Garner, chairman of the humanities division at the college.

The new class is scheduled to meet from 6 to 8 p.m. four nights a week, Monday through Thursday, and offers three units of credit for the six-week session.

The instructor for the class, Mrs. Kathryn H. Clauset, holds a master's degree from UCLA and has taught English and reading at the college during the previous year.

The speed reading class is designed to increase reading speed and comprehension, to increase vocabulary and to improve basic study techniques of students.

Harvard reading films, mechanical reading papers, and motorized reading accelerators are employed in the reading laboratory. In addition, frequent reading rate tests and vocabulary improvement checks are administered.

Registration for the summer session will be held on Thursday and Friday, July 6 and 7, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., and from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Classes start on July 10, and will end Aug. 18. No admission tests or transcripts are required. Any high school graduate or person 18 or over may attend. A complete schedule of summer classes is available at the college admissions office.

**Gardena Given Street Funds**






