

Polio Clinic Series Slated During Week

March of Dimes officials announced here this week that they will co-sponsor a series of polio clinics in the Torrance area next week. Polio shots will be given at a cost of \$1 each.

First of the four scheduled clinics will be held at the Bain Medical Clinic, 2093 Torrance Blvd., at 2 p.m. Wednesday. Dr. Martin F. Bain is chairman of the clinic.

Two clinics will be held Friday, July 28. From 12:30 to 2:30 p.m. shots will be available at Von's Market, 5035 Pacific Coast Highway. A clinic is also to be held at the Van Deene Ave. School from 8:30 to 8:30 p.m.

One more clinic is slated for Saturday, July 29, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the J. C. Penney Store in the Del Amo Shopping Center.

Chairmen of the projects urged parents to protect themselves and their children against the crippling disease before the high incidence season in late summer and early fall.

Republican Coffee Says No to 1962

Tom Coffee, Republican candidate for congress in the 1960 elections against Cecil R. King, has announced that he will not seek elective office in the 1962 elections. Coffee is now working in non-political areas "for the things in which I believe."

The Westchester resident said he has been urged by backers to run for office in the new 31st Congressional District, a district formed from part of the old 17th. He said that he is "certain that both parties can present good men from whom the voters will choose."

Coffee has long maintained that the people of the 17th district have been poorly represented and expressed hope that the candidate elected will place the interest of the district above partisan politics.

Weekly Dances Highlight Park Activity Slate

Unemployment Insurance, Tax Deadline Set

Monday, July 31, is the deadline for filing California Unemployment Insurance wage reports and paying state unemployment insurance taxes for the second quarter of 1961. W. P. Nebergall, auditor in charge for the State Dept. of Employment in Long Beach reminded employers.

Employers who fail to file wage reports and pay second quarter taxes on or before July 31, will reduce their chances of receiving a lower rate next year.

Nebergall pointed out that it is not possible to use payments made after July 31 in computing employer tax rates. In addition, penalty and interest will be charged if the report is filed after the deadline.
