Physics Instructor at El Camino On Seven State Lecturing Tour

Julius Sumner Miller, physics instructor at El Camino college, is currently on a lecture tour of the National Science Foundation Summer Institutes for high school and college physics teachers. Miller's tour will take him to fourteen campuses in seven states. The tour commenced on June 20 and will continue through Aug. 15. Miller is among the leading physics educators in the country specializing in the field of experiments in his field. Purpose of the tour is to bring to the institute participants many of Miller's ideas and some of his enthusiasms developed through many years of experience and intensive study. During the past four summers, Miller has been the instructor for a UCLA National Science Foundation-supported summer institute entitled, "Demonstration Experiments in Physics." Prospective EC Students Urged to Register Soon

Prospective students of El Camino College planning full-time enrollment are currently securing appointments for counseling in the college counseling office.

Advisability of early appointment dates was pointed out this week by W. Holmes Smith, assistant director of student personnel, in charge of counseling and guidance. Smith indicated that students securing early counseling dates generally succeed in registering for the program of classes which they desire.

Late registrants, the college administrator noted, are frequently confronted by closed classes.

PART-TIME students of the college who completed the spring semester at El Camino will register for fall semester classes from 1 to 3 and from 5:30 to 7 p.m. August 2. They are advised to bring spring semester grades with them.

Reservation cards for registration of other part-time stu-

dents are currently available in the college registration office. These students will register from August 24-Sept. 1.

Concert Well Received by Music Lovers

Virtuoso cellist George Neikrug was presented in a concert of chamber music with the gifted pianist, Sidney Stafford, at the Breytspreek-Stafford Studio in Redondo Beach last Sunday, July 23. An enthusiastic audience was delighted by the program of Sonatas by Schubert, Brahms, and Debussy, rarely heard in the South Bay area. This second concert of a series of chamber music events being instituted by this Redondo Beach studio of music attracted a capacity crowd, indicating a strong local interest in fine musicianship and the classics.

Neikrug is an eminent American cellist who has had several successful concert tours of this country and Europe. He was hailed as "one of the elite of cellists" in Salzburg and as a "cellist of extraordinary distinction" in Munich. He leaves shortly for a year of teaching and concertizing in Germany.

Stafford has toured widely as a piano soloist and in chamber music concerts in the United States, Canada, and Europe. He was recognized in Zurich as an "extraordinarily versatile and productive chamber music virtuoso" and as a "very able and gifted pianist" in Brussels. Mr. Stafford recently established himself as a pianist and teacher in the South Bay and is accepting a limited number of pupils.
