Sec. 1775. FORFEITURE FOR PAYING LESS THAN PREVAILING RATE:
The contractor shall forfeit ten dollars for each calendar day, or por-
tion thereof, for each workman paid less than the stipulated prevailing
rate for any public work done under the contract by him or by any sub-
contractor under him.
Provided that, overtime rates, rate of pay for Saturdays, Sundays and
holidays shall apply to those holidays as recognized in the collective bar-
gaining agreement applicable to the particular craft, classification or type
of workman employed on the project.
Provided that, with the above general provisions contained herein,
Guards and Watchmen shall be paid one and one-half times the prevailing
rate for overtime (overtime shall be time worked in excess of eight hours
per day or forty hours per week), and the straight prevailing rate for
