Air Reserve Recovery Group Now Activated

Air Force Reserve facilities on Long Beach Municipal Airport buzzed with activity Saturday for the first time since the 452nd Troop Carrier Wing moved to March Air Force Base last year.

The occasion was the activation of the newly-formed, Air Recovery Group and Squadron commanded by Col. Claude J. Norton of Santa Ana.

The units are composed of men from Long Beach, Orange County, Torrance, South Bay District, and the Compton, Bellflower and Whittier area.

COL. NORTON said that current schedules for the group call for unit training sessions on the last two Saturdays of each month.

Members of the Ready Reserve unit are paid for attendance at the monthly training sessions at the Long Beach Municipal Airport site.

Colonel Norton pointed out that the Recovery units are a new concept in the Air Force Reserve program. Groups and Squadrons have been established at strategic locations in the United States, he said, to provide haven, in the event of war, for combat aircraft returning from missions and un-

able to land at their home base.

THE RESERVE Commander said that it is believed that in war time many of the home bases of the combat bombers would be destroyed, making it necessary for the aircraft to seek other landing facilities where necessary services could be provided.

The Long Beach Recovery Group and Squadron aims to cooperate with the civilian agencies in control of the airport in making these services available.

THE 8648TH Air Force Recovery Group and other Reserve units of the same type include units for communications, crash and rescue, refueling, medical transportation and other services.

Reserve airmen are still being sought to fill vacancies in both the Group and Squadron.

The Personnel Office at the base, located at Spring St. and Redondo Ave., Long Beach, will be open from 7:30 a.m. until 4 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday to answer questions regarding the Recovery units.
