

Rolling into high gear on its huge \$5-million expansion and remodeling program, westcoast family apparel chain, Foreman & Clark, will open five new stores and reopen two enlarged stores in three different states, all within a period of 16 weeks.

Strong newspaper advertising will be used primarily to promote all openings, according to Foreman & Clark's president, Samuel J. Kerzner.

This will be quickly followed by re-openings of greatly expanded stores in San Francisco and Sacramento, another new store in Sacramento's Southgate Center, plus new stores in Kansas City, and Los Angeles' Lakewood and Midtown Shopping Centers.

The additions will bring the Foreman & Clark total to 26 stores in the organization.

"NOR DO WE stop there," Kerzner stated. "Plans are already under way for further expansion into the Texas area next spring. We have utmost confidence in the strength and economy of our nation and we believe the promise of the present decade will be fulfilled.

Foreman & Clark is associated with the Howard and Ripley clothing organization on the east coast.
