Army Pvt. Kelly J. Gruber, son of Mr. and Mrs. Johnnie Gruber, 20837 Margaret St., is a member of the Army-Air Force team which operates the Air Defense Control Center at Naha Air Base, Okinawa.

Gruber and other members of the team maintain an around-the-clock alert against enemy aircraft and missiles. They are responsible for the early warning and identification of an enemy air attack and also for directing the interception against such in attack. The Air Defense Control Center constantly scan the Okinawan skies with intricate electronic detection devices.

Gruber, assigned to Headquarters Battery of the 30th Artillery Brigade, entered the Army in January 1961, completed basic training at Fort Ord, Calif., and arrived overseas last July.

The 19-year-old soldier is a 1961 graduate of Banning High School in Wilmington.

Specialist Four David E. Kealey, 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald E. Kealey, 1604 Flower St., recently completed the five-week aircraft mechanics apprentice course at the Army Aviation School, Fort Rucker, Ala.

He received training in the servicing and maintenance of fixed and rotary wing aircraft.

Specialist Kealey, a 1956 graduate of Torrance High School, attended El Camino Junior College before entering the Army in July 1958.

Missile Part Contract to Local Plant

Development of components for the Mauler missile system will be undertaken by the Vernitron Corp. of Torrance and New York under the terms of a contract awarded to the firm this week by General Dynamics.

The Torrance Area Youth Bands consist of two groups, the Youth Band, composed of students of the upper three grades of high school, and the Junior Youth Band which is made up of students of the 7th, 8th, and 9th grades. Both bands are directed by James Van Dyck, and supported by the parents and the city of Torrance through its youth music promotion program.


THE YOUTH BAND, consisting of around 45 highly talented high school musicians, centers its activities on the performance of concerts and special events staged around the community.
