Walther League to Show Narcotics Film Sunday

Ascension Lutheran Walther League will show "Assassin of Youth" Sunday at 7 p.m. The hard hitting narcotics film will be shown to the public at Ascension Lutheran Church, 17910 Prairie Ave.

"Assassin of Youth" is owned and distributed by the Narcotics Educational Foundation of America. This is a private organization of dedicated citizens who, aware of the evils of drug addiction, donate their time and talents in the education of the public.

Norman Hookland of South Laguna will speak on the narcotics problem in Southern California. Hookland, who is a contractor in Laguna Beach, fills many speaking engagements each week for the Narcotics Educational Foundation.

THE FILM is an objective treatment of narcotic problems from the social, psychological, and legalistic standpoints. The various narcotics are discussed including characteristics of plants, means of identification, and the effects on the human body. True case histories of teenage addicts are also presented.

The Walther League recognizes that education of the public is important in protecting themselves and other young people like them from the pitfalls of narcotics.

A "FAMILY NIGHT" is planned, starting with a potluck supper at 5:30 p.m. The Walther League will furnish rolls and coffee. Each family is asked to bring a salad, hot dish, or dessert. The program will start at 7 p.m. A nursery will be furnished for small children and infants during the film and speaker.
