

## El Camino Forensic Group To Open Season Oct. 13-14

El Camino College's forensic group will open the 1961-62 season against San Diego State College Oct. 13 and 14. Debate topic for the year, selected by a national representative committee, "Resolved: That labor organizations should be under the jurisdiction of anti-trust organ-

izations." During the season, which will last until April or May, ECC teams will match skills with 54 junior colleges and universities, including USC, Redlands University, Long Beach State College, Los Angeles State College, and Occidental College. This program

results in 70 to 75 debates in the fall semester and an increased number in the spring. ADVISER OF the forensic group, Harold Borden, described two objectives of the speech activity. "The first is to provide a broad participation—any stu-


dent may profit from forensics and any student is welcome to our group. The second goal is to make the best possible showing for El Camino College in competition." Borden feels that experience in debating offers unlimited opportunities and enormous possibilities to the student. It

helps him gain confidence and poise in front of others, to learn to read and speak critically, and to learn the basic oral process of our democracy. A NATIVE of South Dakota, Borden graduated from Northwestern University with a bachelor of science degree. He toured Europe in the summer of 1956 and attended Oxford University in England. Returning to the United States, he spent two years at USC as an

assistant to the director of forensics. He is now working for his master's degree at USC. This is his first year on the El Camino campus. The Warrior team won the National Junior College Championship held in Arizona, in 1959, when Burt Dumais won first place in interpretive reading. Topic for the 1959-60 season was, "Resolved: That Congress should be given the power to reverse the decisions of the Supreme Court."

## Cabrillo Savings Hails First Quarter Success

Cabrillo Savings, the community's newest savings and loan association, ended its first full quarter of operations with total assets of \$2,100,000, according to Fred Strohmenger, executive vice president and manager. This was the figure

for the quarter ending September 30. "This rapid growth reflects the demand in the area for a locally owned and independent savings institution that is organized specifically to serve the people of this community," Strohmenger said. "We are gratified by the large number of accounts from individuals, families, and organizations in the Torrance area."

## Leaders Open Drive for Chest Fund

More than 50 executives and employees assigned to supervise solicitations for the Community Chest in the Harbor Area were present at a luncheon here Monday in preparation for the coming campaign. Harold Frenz of Bank of America, chairman of the Harbor Area Commerce and Industry division of the united appeal, greeted the workers and introduced representatives of the Community Chest, loaned by business and industry, who exhorted the group to begin immediate planning for plant solicitations.

Meeting at the Cabrillo offices in Rolling Hills Plaza, Pacific Coast Highway and Crenshaw, the directors have voted to pay interest at the rate of 4½ per cent for the quarter ending Dec. 31. This is the highest current rate being paid on insured savings accounts. All accounts in Cabrillo Savings are protected to \$10,000.00 by Federal agency insurance.

A formula of giving based on eight minutes of pay each week under the payroll deduction plan, was stressed by Irving Meyers, insurance executive, loaned by his company for the duration of the campaign. A motion picture, portraying typical approaches to fellow employees, was presented as well as 10 steps suggested to assure success in raising the quota for the commerce and industry division of the united appeal for 170 agencies within the Community Chest budget.

## Contract Due For Hospital Substation

Supervisor Burton W. Chace announced today that a contract probably would be awarded in the next two weeks for the construction of an electrical substation to serve the Harbor General Hospital now under construction at Carson Street and Vermont Avenue. Seven contractors submitted bids to the office of County Engineer John A. Lambie with a price range from \$23,271 to \$33,330. The apparent low bidder was the firm of Schurr and Findlay, Inc., Yorba Linda.

## Two BMHS Students Advanced

Two Bishop Montgomery High School students have been selected as semifinalists in the 1961-62 Merit Scholarship competition, it was revealed here yesterday by Principal Father Joseph M. Pekarick of the school. Students reaching the semifinals in the national competition were Robert Healy, 1601 El Prado, editor of the "Excalibur" school yearbook; and Robert Allen, Palos Verdes Estates, president of the Student Council.

Lambie reported that the low bid was well within the county engineer's estimate and added that this sub-station will provide electrical service for existing facilities, the acute unit and outpatients' building and the central heating plant and laundry now under construction, plus future construction planned for the site. Work under this contract is expected to be completed within seven months, well in advance of the completion of the hospital which is scheduled to be finished late next year.

Principal Pekarick said the two students were among approximately 10,000 throughout the country who attained the semifinalist status through high scores on qualifying examinations. These students will take another examination on Dec. 2. It will include the three-hour scholastic aptitude test of the college entrance examination board.






