

EC Gridders Trek North, Engage Renegades

Fresh from a 28-20 victory at San Diego in the Metropolitan Conference opener, El Camino College travels to Bakersfield in an attempt to march on to a pennant season, Saturday.

Last year the Renegades trounced the Warriors 55-6 and they again show signs of another promising year. In their first outing the Renegades smothered Southern Utah Falls, 69-0.

The Tribe sports a 2-1 record with wins over Weber, 44-0, and San Diego 28-20. Their sole upset was handed to them by a powerful Boise squad, 70-20.

IN TWO years of play under the hand of Coach Ray Newman, the Renegades have won 19 of 20 games, and another banner season is in prospect.

Newman lost his two top quarterbacks to Texas teams, Bob Ezell going to West Texas University and Dean Newby to Houston. He has another letterman signal-caller back in

Paul Franklin, and inherited Kenny Lott, who lettered at Cal Poly of San Louis Obispo. Freshman Rick Swen also is proving a valuable find.

FOURTEEN other vets are back: four ends, including Bruce McDonald, who was an all-service star for three straight years; 1960 starting center Jerry Young, two halfbacks, including '60 starter Dick Jones, and fullback Clifton Chilton.

Newman has shaved 94 candidates down to a shapely score of 75, but is still concerned because he has only three players back from last year's first 22. In the Utah contest, 55 Renegades saw action as the coach took an expansive look at his sizeable crew.

"WE WON'T have the same depth in the backfield and not as much speed as in former years," Newman says, "but our line has all the potential of being as good as last year. We'll

have more agility and speed. There is still sorrow at Bakersfield since all-everything halfback Billy Mackey went looking for greener pastures at Michigan State.

IN THEIR first Metro outing Camino displayed a potent passing attack with quarterback John Torak passing to ends Mike Andrews and Kurt Alteneberg for several first downs.

Jim Allison turned in the outstanding run of the evening when he galloped 88 yards to the Knights' four-yard line before Jerry Thagard went over for the score.

EL CAMINO scored on its first play from scrimmage when Allison passed to Andrews, who was stationed in the end zone, for six points. The game was a minute and 15 seconds old.

Dennis Hearn and Howard Taylor accounted for the Warrior's other scores, with George O'Brien and Allison chalking up the two pointers.
