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## Community Groups Urged to Pin Prominent Badge on Area Voters

 Joanne M. Forsythe, Manhattan Beach, has suggested that each person who has voted pin on his or her clothes, in a conspicuous place, the small printed coupon which is given to each voter, after he or she has voted, and wear this coupon during election day until the closing of the polls.

"This coupon, which is printed on a light-weight, small piece of cardboard, reads: 'This small number shall be torn off by the inspector and handed to the voter,' and then the coupon carries serial numbers.

"I AGREE with Joanne M. Forsythe and commend her for her interest in good government. I do not know with which political party she is registered, and it makes no difference, because her idea is applicable to all good citizens who vote.

However, I shall go even further in advancing the idea offered by Joanne M. Forsythe, and say that I believe that in each community organizations such as the League of Women Voters, who agree with me on most important issues; the American Legion; the Veterans of the Foreign Wars of the United States; other veteran organizations; Chambers of Commerce; Rotary; Lions; Kiwanis; Optimists, and other service clubs should all band together and place at the polling places badges saying: 'I have voted. Have you?' The polls close at ... stating the hour.

THIS IDEA of providing citizens who have voted with a badge to wear on election day is by no means my own original idea. It has been put into practice for many years in California by many different organizations. The only thing original about my comments is that I do believe that all civic organizations in each community should unite in performing this useful public service and not leave the responsibility, expense and effort to one organization. All should share the load and all should work in harmony.

DURING THE nearly 12 years that I have been a member of the Assembly, 46th District, California State Legislature, thousands of men and women have come to me on the street, after public events, during the informal discussions which follow fraternal and civic organization meetings, and at purely social gatherings. They offer suggestions about new laws which they think are needed, or amendments to existing laws.

I first ask them where they live. If they do not live in the 46th Assembly District, I suggest that they write to their own Assemblyman, and also to State Senator Richard Richards. I then give them my card and tell them that after contacting their own Assemblyman and our State Senator from Los Angeles County, that if they still want my help they should write to me.

IF THEY live in the 46th Assembly District, or tell me that they have relatives or friends who do live within this district, I listen longer and try to make notes on their suggestions, but I always give them my card and urge them to put their ideas in writing and mail them to me so that I can open a file on their recommendations and follow up on their ideas at the next session of the Legislature.

(1) I do not ask anyone to vote for me. The old political cliché "Your vote for me will be appreciated" is out of date and too "corny." I merely state my stand on issues, mail out folders about my record, and present what I believe to be a constructive program for future State legislation.

(2) I DO not ask anyone if he has voted for me in the past or intends to vote for me in the future. Obviously, it would be a foolish question, because most citizens regard their vote as a personal matter, although some volunteer their intentions.

(3) I do not ask people their recommendations on State legislation and what their occupation is, because each person is interested in laws affecting his occupation, his hobby, and the welfare of his family, in addition to the very much broader issues of water, taxation, communism, narcotics, etc.
