PROTEIN FOODS
 POULTRY. Broiler-Fryers, October expects to bring 10 per cent more broiler-fryers than we had a year ago. This means only one thing to homemakers . . . more good low-cost menus. There will be "whole-bird" specials, and you'll see promotions on splits, cutups, and select pieces, too.
 Barbecuing still goes on in California. Both chickens and turkeys seem to have been made with barbecuing in mind.
 Turkey marketing is expected to be about 25 per cent over October 1960 levels. A versatile bird, that's turkey. No limit to the ways it can be served.
BEEF, LAMB, PORK and VEAL in ample supply. Think of the savory meals to be prepared by using the less tender cuts in stews, fricassees, curry, loaves, and pot roasts. Wonderful for these beautiful Indian summer days . . . your cooking becomes more inspired.
DAIRY PRODUCTS
 How to keep cheese at home is a troublesome question. The obvious answer as to whether cheese should be refrigerated is to note how it is kept at modern food markets. If you buy the

cheese from a refrigerated case then keep it refrigerated at home.
 Cheese spreads sell from market shelves. Once these jars are opened they must be kept refrigerated.
 Soft, unripened cheeses . . . cottage, cream, and Neufchatel . . . are perishable and should be used within a few days.
 Ripened or cured cheeses keep well in refrigerator for several days. Keep protected from mold or drying out. Leave the original wrapper on cheese, or cover with wax paper, foil or plastic wrapping.
 Mold that forms on natural cheese is not harmful. Just scrape it off the surface. The particular mold found in the interior of Blue, Gorgonzola, Roquefort, or Stilton has been developed to produce flavor . . . it is part of the cheese.
