Hospital Gets Data Processor

A new electronic data processing system designed to swiftly provide necessary data needed to guarantee continued high patient care has been installed at the Riviera Community Hospital, Robert W. Lyons, administrator, announced this week.

The system is the Professional Activity Study of the Commission on Professional and Hospital Activities, a group sponsored by the American College of Physicians, American College of Surgeons, American Hospital Assn., and the Southwestern Michigan Hospital Council.

UNDER THE program all information concerning medical care at the hospital is forwarded to the commission's offices where it is tabulated by machine and returned through several reports which reflect the hospital's operation as well as comparing their figures with the many other hospitals throughout the nation in the plan.

These reports enable the hospital to better evaluate its own services and make any changes necessary to insure the best care.

"WHILE MOST advances in automation are not applicable to hospital use, this type of data processing is expected to be of extreme importance to the Riviera Community Hospital. As a non-profit, community facility, we are always interested in improving service, and now we will not only have all care data at our fingertips, but we will be able to compare our work with other hospitals. This is just another of the many things the hospital does to insure the best service," Lyons said.
