INTEREST: The bonds shall bear interest at a rate to be fixed upon the sale thereof but not to exceed 5% per annum, payable annually the first year and semiannually thereafter.

PAYMENT: Said bonds and the interest thereon are payable in lawful money of the United States at the office of the Treasurer of the County of Los Angeles, in the City of Los Angeles, State of California, or at any of the fiscal agencies of the County of Los Angeles, in the City of Los Angeles, State of California, or in the City of Chicago, State of Illinois, at the option of the holders.

REGISTRATION: The bonds will be coupon bonds registrable only as to both principal and interest.

NOT CALLABLE: The bonds are not callable before maturity.

LIABILITY: Said bonds are general obligations of said district, payable both principal and interest from the taxes levied thereon, under the laws now in force, may be levied upon all of the taxable property except certain property, in said district.

TERMS OF SALE
Interest Rate: The maximum rate payable annually the first year and semiannually thereafter. The rate to be paid shall be a rate not more than one percent above the rate of interest then in effect.

Award: The bonds shall be sold for cash. All bids must be for not less than all of the bonds hereby offered for sale and each bid shall state the bidder offers to pay and accrued interest to the date of delivery, the premium, if any, and the average net interest rate determined by the Board of Supervisors, which shall be considered informative only and not a part of the bid.

Bidder: The bonds will be awarded to the highest responsible bidder or bidders considering the interest rate and the premium offered, if any. The highest bid will be determined by deducting the amount of the premium bid (if any) from the total amount of interest which would be required to be paid from the date of sale of the bonds to the respective maturity date specified in the bid and the award will be made on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the district. The purchaser must pay accrued interest, computed on a 360-day year basis, from the date of the bonds to the date of delivery. The cost of printing the bonds will be borne by the district.

Right of Rejection: The Board of Supervisors reserves the right, in its discretion, to accept all bids and to the extent not prohibited by law to waive any irregularity in any bid.

Prompt Award: The Board of Supervisors will take action awarding the bonds to the successful bidder not later than twenty-six hours after the expiration of the time herein prescribed for the receipt of proposals; provided, that the award may be delayed until the expiration of the specified time if the successful bidder at the office of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, in the City of Los Angeles, California.

Prompt Delivery: Cancellation for Late Delivery: It is expected that said bonds will be delivered to the successful bidder within 30 days from the date of the award. The successful bidder shall have the right, at his option, to cancel the contract of purchase and the district shall then for delivery within 60 days from the date of the award thereof, and in such event the successful bidder shall be entitled to the return of the deposit accompanying his bid.

Form of Bid: Each bid, together with the bid check, must be in sealed envelope, addressed to Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County, and accompanied by a proposal as a guaranty that the bidder, if successful, will accept and pay for said bonds in accordance with the terms of his bid. The proceeds of the check accompanying any accepted proposal shall be applied on the purchase price or, if such proposal is accepted but not performed, unless such failure of performance shall be caused by any act or omission of the district, shall be retained by the County Treasurer for the benefit of the district. The check accompanying such unaccepted proposal will be returned promptly.

Change in Tax Exempt Status: At any time before the bonds are tendered for delivery the successful bidder may disaffirm and withdraw his proposal if the interest received by private holders from bonds of the same type and character shall be either by ruling of the Bureau of Internal Revenue or by a decision of any federal court, or shall be declared invalid by the terms of any federal income tax law enacted subsequent to the date of the award of the bonds.

No Litigation Certificate: At the time of payment for and delivery of said bonds to the district will furnish the successful bidder a certificate that there is no litigation pending affecting the validity of the bonds.
