Veal Cutlets in Wine

1 1/2 lb. veal round steak. Cut 1/4 inch thick. Wipe clean with damp cloth. Pound meat for tenderness. Dredge in flour, salt and pepper. Heat skillet over low heat. Melt two or three tablespoons of butter. Brown meat over medium heat. Add 1/2 cup Morcela wine and 1/3 cup pitted sliced green olives. Simmer until tender.

Lime Jello and Sour Cream Salad

1 pkg. lime jello 1/2 small pkg. sour cream
1 cup crushed pineapple 1 1/4 cup hot water and (drained) pineapple juice
Add water to jello. Mix in pineapple and sour cream. Let set until firm.

Ice Cream Cake

Make one recipe of Devil's Food Cake mixture. Spread in two 9x13 pans. Bake. When cold spread 1 qt. vanilla ice cream on each pan. Top with 1/2 pt. whipped cream. Over the top, sprinkle chopped nuts and crushed pineapple. Freeze. Take out of freezer 20 minutes before serving. Serves 20.

No Bake Cookies

In a saucepan place 1 cube oleo, 1/2 cup milk, 2 cups sugar and three tsp. cocoa. Bring to full boil. Let boil for one minute. Remove from heat, add 1/2 cup chunky peanut butter and three cups quick oatmeal. Mix thoroughly. Spoon onto wax paper to cool and set.

They were twin sisters, Mrs. Agnete Melbye of Copenhagen, Denmark and Mrs. Else Resting of Washington, D. C.

Mrs. Resting is secretary to the Danish Consul in Washington. During the war, she served as interpreter for the Americans during the German occupation.

The two visitors are sisters of Holger Bladt, president of the Rebild National Park Board in Denmark. The park, which was purchased by Max Henius, a United States citizen, was presented to the King of Denmark, who in turn presented it to the State of Denmark for a national park.

The park is located at Heather Hills near Alborg in Jutland, Denmark. In the park is a replica of Abraham Lincoln's log cabin, made from logs sent from the United States, a prairie wagon, Indians and other symbols of this country.

On July 4 each year, an outstanding American is invited to speak at the Rebild Fest. This year the speaker will be Richard M. Nixon. Last year the speaker was Walt Disney. Knudsen of Knudsen Creamery was also a special guest last year.

On July 4, the American flag is flown on the level with the Denmark flag. The flags from 50 states are also flown from the top of the flag pole to the speaker's stand.
