Registration Open for Harbor Summer Classes

An opportunity for high school graduates to get an early start on their college education was extended yesterday by Dr. Robert Bacon, dean of the Summer Session of Harbor College, as he named Thursday and Friday as early registration days at the Wilmington institution.

"The summer program can be used either to speed up a student's college career or to make up deficiencies," said Bacon. "Although 70 per cent of our students are currently attending college, we think there are great benefits for the June high school graduate in becoming accustomed to a college atmosphere and college work."

"Among courses that we would especially recommend are classes in speed reading and English fundamentals as it has been determined that the use of English is the most important factor in determining college grades."

THE HOURS of 6 to 8 p.m. have been reserved for registering high school graduates

next Thursday and Friday. A second registration period is scheduled July 5 and 6. Classes are available both days and evenings. For summer session, permits and transcripts are not required and there are no residential restrictions. The summer session runs from July 9 to Aug. 17.





