SCHMIDT, who says he is enjoying his work with the group because of the amazing variety of talent in Los Cancioneros, made his first public appearance locally at Coffee House Positano in Malibu.

He has since been seen on television on the Henry Morgan show and with Joey Bishop on the Joey Bishop show, as well as in appearances at the Bow and Arrow Club. He terms his humor, "an experiment in comedy designed to lightly titillate the intellectual palate."

Critics comment that he is above all, an "iconoclastic chauvinist" at heart. His act seems based on misconceptions of fact, misinterpretations of reality, cloudy thinking and a misplaced metaphysical bone which causes him to

He studied at the University of Michigan, where he says majored in math and liberal arts, and minored in just about everything. At the Patchwork Players, a summer stock acting school in Roanoke, Va., he studied under Francis Ballard. He won his highest acting honors as the off stage voice in "The Voice of the Turtle." During the war he took Anti-Submarine Warfare training in Key West and was on the first minesweeper (and first ship) into Tokyo harbor to sweep out mines so the U.S.S. Los Angeles could come in and claim that she was the first.
