**Bloodmobile to Visit Torrance on May 31**

The Red Cross bloodmobile will make its next stop in Torrance Thursday, May 31st, according to Mrs. Robert Orsini, chairman of blood recruitment for the Torrance-Lomita Red Cross branch. Collection facilities to accommodate 275 donors will be set up at the Elks Lodge, 1820 Abalone St., from 2:30 to 7 p.m. Those wishing to make donor appointments or desiring further information about the Red Cross blood program are asked to call Mrs. Orsini at FA 8-0647 between 10 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Although the regional blood center in downtown Los Angeles accepts donors daily, the mobile unit is in this community only on scheduled dates throughout the year.  REGARDLESS of where or how the Society is contacted, the procedure followed for processing memorial gifts is identical. It begins with a request from the donor - by telephone, by letter or by a personal visit to the Society's office at 804 E. Manchester Blvd., Inglewood. The donor provides the name of the person in whose memory or honor the gift is being made, the name and address of the person who should be notified of the gift, and his own name and address. The office then sends acknowledgements to all concerned. The family of the person in whose honor a gift is made is never told the amount of the gift, but receives a simple, dignified card saying the gift has been made.

**Volunteers Processing Cancer Gifts**

Volunteer workers will be on duty at the American Cancer Society's Inglewood office from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. between now and Memorial Day to process memorial gifts, according to H. P. Atherton, Cancer Society District Crusade Chairman. He said that memorial contributions to the Society traditionally increase during May when many donors regularly make gifts honoring loved ones and friends who have passed away.

EVERY MEMORIAL, large or small, goes directly into the fight against cancer, Atherton said. Each gift helps support cancer research, saves lives through education, and provides service to cancer patients and their families.

The memorial program of the American Cancer Society has assumed its present form during the past ten years. It grew out of frequent requests from the public for a means to convey sympathy and compassion to families to cancer victims.

Today the program has taken on a broader meaning, with people commemorating many different kinds of events with memorial gifts to the Society.

AT THE same time the family is notified, a receipt is sent to the donor. This is an important part of the memorial program, since memorial contributions are deductible for tax purposes. Atherton invited anyone wishing more information about the Society's memorial program to contact the District office at OR 2-8148.
